

"Send Forth a Dove"

Among the Trinity, The Holy Spirit is the entity that assumes many different forms. The image of the dove is one that is sent forth to comfort and encourage. It appeared at Jesus' baptism to herald the start of His ministry. Although we generally associate the flame with Pentecost, the Holy Spirit as a dove also encourages us to spread the Gospel.

Joseph M. Martin, (b. 1959) earned his Bachelor's Degree in Piano Performance from Furman University in South Carolina. While in undergrad school, he served as choral accompanist under Milburn Price and became inspired to compose. Dr. Martin has over 1200 compositions to his credit and serves as Director of Sacred Music at Shawnee Press. "Send Forth a Dove" is his completely original composition, as he wrote the text as well as the music.

Pentecost Basics

Long before Pentecost became known as the birthday of the Church, it was a joyous harvest festival in the Old Testament called the Feast of Weeks (*Shavuot*). Celebrated fifty days after Passover, it marked the end of the barley harvest and the beginning of the wheat harvest (Leviticus 23:15–21). God's people would bring the first fruits of their crops to the Temple as an offering of thanksgiving, celebrating God's abundant provision.

Jewish tradition also links this festival to the giving of the Law at Mount Sinai. After God delivered the Israelites from Egypt, they arrived at Sinai around fifty days later. There, God gave them the Ten Commandments, establishing them as His covenant people.

Centuries later, during the same festival, God poured out His Spirit on the disciples in Jerusalem (Acts 2). Just as God gave His Law to His people at Sinai, He now wrote His law on believers' hearts (Jeremiah 31:33). Pentecost became a day of new beginnings: the Holy Spirit empowering the Church to share the good news of Jesus with the world. Red is often worn on Pentecost Sunday as a sign of the Holy Spirit.
