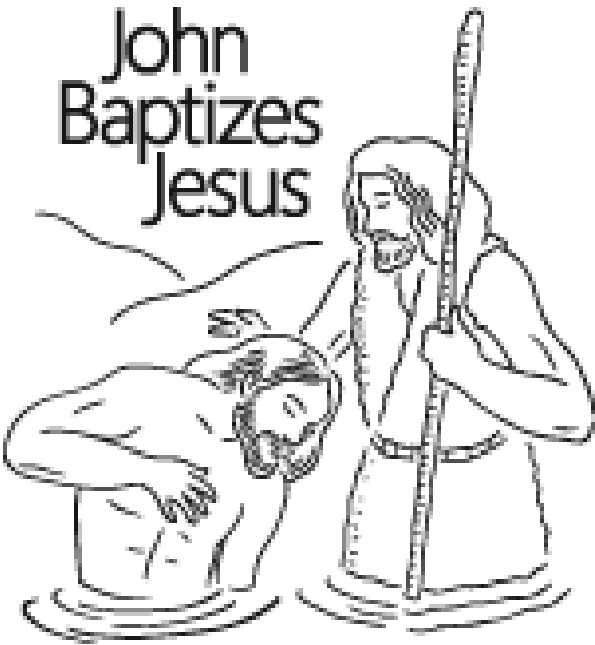

“Shall We Gather at the River?”

Robert Lowry (1826-1899) was known as a cheerful man with a prominent beard and a quick mind. Often called the “Good Doctor,” he served as pastor to several Baptist churches in the mid-19th Century. His great strengths as a preacher were a vivid imagination and his ability to engage his parishioners with verbal pictures.

Lowry also composed a number of well-known hymns, including “How Can I Keep from Singing?” (“My Life Flows on in Endless Song”) and “Nothing but the Blood of Jesus.” However, he is best remembered for “Shall We Gather at the River?” Although frequently sung at baptisms, its intended message is about Heaven. It draws on the imagery of crossing the River Jordan into the Promised Land.

A number of composers have set this hymn in their own styles. One of my personal favorites is Aaron Copland. Fred Bock’s arrangement of this hymn combines the original words and melody with a flowing accompaniment that suggests the river described in the song.
