“How Can I Keep From Singing?”

Robert Lowry (1826-1899) was known as a cheerful man with a prominent beard and a quick mind. Often called the “Good Doctor”, he served as pastor to several Baptist churches in the mid-19th Century. His great strengths as a preacher were a vivid imagination and his ability to engage his parishioners with verbal pictures.

This song is also known by its first line, “My life flows on in endless song.” It is often mistakenly identified as a Quaker hymn. Since it is now in the public domain, it has been printed in several hymnals. The words were published by Lowry in 1869 in his songbook, *Bright Jewels for the Sunday School*. It also appeared in 1869 in a British periodical, *The Christian Pioneer*.

During the 20th Century, the song was not widely used in hymnals. In 1941, the first hymnal to include it was *The Church Hymnal* by the Seventh Day Adventist Church under the title, “My life flows on”. The United Methodist Church included it in its 2000 hymnal supplement, *The Faith We Sing*. Pete Seeger frequently performed his version of it during the folk revival of the 1960’s. It’s been recorded by a number of folk artists, including Enya.

“The Lord Bless You and Keep You”

John Rutter took a very traditional benediction text and created his own interpretation with a flowing keyboard accompaniment. The sevenfold “Amen” is particularly haunting, with a soprano line that soars to a full climax before its slow decrescendo to the end.
