Why Become a Member?

Many people ask, “Why should I join the church if I can simply continue attending worship?” While membership is not required to worship, grow in faith, or experience God's grace, it is an important step in deepening your walk with Christ and participating more fully in the life of the church.

Belonging

The word of God talks about the family of God as a body of connected parts. Membership is a way of saying, “These are my people,” and then connecting to share in worship, prayer, fellowship, and service.

Commitment

Membership is a covenant commitment to grow as a disciple alongside others who encourage and support one another in faith. The disciples were *devoted* to gathering with one another. (*Acts 2:42*)

Participation

Members help shape the church's future through voting on important matters, and electing officers. They serve, lead, and participate in congregational life. (*1 Peter 4:10*)

Calling

Membership opens doors to use your spiritual gifts and respond to God's call, including opportunities to serve as an elder or deacon. (*1 Corinthians 12:7*)

Profession

Membership includes a public profession of faith, declaring before God and others your commitment to follow Jesus Christ. *"Everyone therefore who acknowledges me before others, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven."* (Matthew 10:32)

The bottom line is membership is not about drawing a line between insiders and outsiders. It is about taking the next step in discipleship by making a covenant commitment to Christ and to a particular community of faith.

So, whether you are considering membership or simply want to learn more about the church, Membership Matters is a great opportunity to enrich your understanding and experience of the First Presbyterian Church of Rogers.
